## WHY PRIME REGISTRY?

PRIME Registry is a non-profit, nation-wide, primary care clinical data registry. Launched by the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) in 2016, the registry can serve as a valuable resource for Family Medicine residency programs across the nation – especially those located in rural and underserved communities. PRIME provides quality data tracking, reporting and analysis, with a suite of integrated tools for population health, identifying care gaps, and addressing patient social needs.

### Tools that Facilitate and Enhance Residency Program Training Requirements

Using PHATE™ (Population Health Assessment Engine), Care Gap, and the Patient Reported Outcomes module, Family Medicine residents have the opportunity to improve patient care, participate in valuable research opportunities, learn the ins and outs of the value-based payment environment, and better serve their local communities.

### Low-cost

PRIME Registry is funded by the ABFM Foundation, and supported by the Foundation's Center for Professionalism & Value in Health Care (The CPV) with the aim of reducing burden and burnout, supporting professionalism and advocating more resources for primary care.

- PRIME is **free** to ABFM Diplomates, and only \$500/year for all other clinicians.
- Funding may be available to subsidize residency participants via the ABFM Foundation

### Low Burden

- The operating burden is low, requiring only a few hours per month to validate data, update clinicians, and export any needed reports.
- PRIME doesn't require a physician to administrate—any administrator can easily work with the dashboard, accessing the data and reports as needed with minimal training.

### Dedicated Training and Support from the ABFM's PRIME Registry Team

Residency programs using PRIME can count on the PRIME Registry team to provide training, answer questions, and act as a liaison between the technology platform provider and your users to ensure you have the resources you need. We host monthly live, interactive webinars, and can also schedule trainings based on your program's needs.

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## PRIME REGISTRY OVERVIEW

PRIME Registry's suite of tools and support can help your program meet the newly updated requirements.

PRIME Provides a practical, inexpensive and simple to implement training tool for tracking quality, addressing equity, teaching COPC, understanding patients in the context of their community, opportunities for research with the data, tools, and potential scholarship opportunities with the CPV

### Specifically, PRIME Registry features:

- Tools for identifying and addressing care gaps (Care Gap, Reports, Quality Dashboard)
- Population health tools (PHATE™, Care Gap) for assessing social deprivation risk for each patient, helping you address population and patient social needs, and quickly connect with community resources
- Dashboards and customizable reports that streamline sharing quality data across your organization, with payers, health care systems, and other relevant entities (Quality Dashboard, Reports)
- An integrated dashboard for fielding, tracking and analyzing multiple Patient Reported Outcomes measures (PRO Dashboard)
- Quality reporting for the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS), MIPS Value Pathways, Making Care Primary (MCP), and other APMs (MIPS Dashboard, MVPs Dashboard)

### Specific Program Requirements PRIME Can Help Address:

#### HELP ENSURE ADEQUATE TRAINING RESOURCES ARE AVAILABLE

PRIME provides a cost-effective and efficient training resource for quality measurement, tracking and analysis

#### HELP MITIGATE INEQUITY

PRIME includes population health mapping, social deprivation risk scoring, and easy access to local community resources, integrated with care gap tools

- PRIME includes an integrated platform for fielding, collecting, tracking, analyzing and reporting on Patient-Reported Outcomes measures

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- PRIME enhances the connection to the local community through the Care Gap and PHATE population health tools. PRIME and PHATE help connect the dots between patients, social, geographic and environmental factors that may be affecting patient outcomes
- Both PRIME and the embedded PHATE tool have actionable, built-in resources for identifying patient social needs and connecting them to resources to help address those needs.
- With [two curricula](#) designed specifically for training in Community Oriented Primary Care, the PHATE Curriculum and the PHATE PI Activity, residents can explore, understand, and better connect to the community in which their patients live, enhancing empathy and supporting equity initiatives.

Additionally, [PRIME Registry is a benefit of board certification](#), free to ABFM diplomates, and can be utilized to help maintain continuous certification.
